A: delete from myTable where is_booked = 'yes' AND contract_reference IS NULL; Penn State coach Bill O'Brien said on Wednesday that a variety of factors played into the decision to leave running back Saquon Barkley at home for this week's game against Iowa. "Well, as you know, it's up to the head coach," O'Brien said when asked what went into the decision to leave Barkley off the travel squad. "Saquon's running the ball well, but he's got some red zone issues. So, the thing that's the most important thing to me is who runs it the best. "And on this team, he does. To have him play in this game, he's a first-team All-Big Ten player, he's a great football player, great kid, really fun guy and he's run as hard as he can all year. But just having him in there at this point, I think, is a mistake. So, that's what was the decision there." Barkley has carried the ball just 25 times for 141 yards (5.4 avg) and two touchdowns for the Nittany Lions. He did not make the trip to Iowa, and did not suit up for that contest, but was present when the team buses returned to State College on Wednesday morning. O'Brien said that Barkley would be back on the field for the Nittany Lions in the conference opener against Maryland on Sept. 16. Barkley was the consensus national player of the year in 2017, rushing for 1,609 yards and 17 touchdowns and catching 30 passes for 347 yards and three touchdowns for the Nittany Lions, who went 11-2 overall and finished No. 4 in the final AP poll.
